Summary of regulations:

(Unless noted otherwise, each course is 15 credits)

- At least 360 credits (24 courses)
- All the compulsory courses
- No more than 165 credits (11 courses) at the 100-level
- At least 75 credits (five courses) at the 300-level
- Pass all the courses required for an Individual major, including 30 credits (two courses) at 300-level with same prefix from two of the following: ACCT, BMGT, ECON, FINC, MGMT, MKTG, VAPM
Note: These courses are normally taken in your final year.
