University of Montevideo - Uruguay

- Uruguay is the smallest Hispanic country in South America, bordered to the north by Brazil and to the west by Argentina.
- With a population of 1.5 million, Montevideo is Uruguay's capital, its largest city, and biggest port. It stretches nearly 20km east to west and has a wide variety of neighbourhoods, each with its own unique character
- The University's Department of Economics ranked in the top 10 in Latin America, according to Tilburg University's Worldwide Economics Schools Research Ranking.

Academic and course information

At UM, courses are taught in Spanish. The School of Business offers courses in English as part of the International Business Program in Semester 2 (August-December). These courses are a viable option for students who wish to study in Latin America but are not comfortable with taking a full course load in Spanish.
