## LU Sport Update

Welcome back to semester 2 and the business end of the sporting season for our rugby and netball teams. With the RWC this year rugby finishes two weeks earlier than previous years.

The semi finals will be held this Saturday the 30th. The 1st XV will play Burnside for the plate semi, and the Senior Div 2 play HSOB in their plate semi. Our Premier Colts side take on HSOB in the Championship semi finals and the U20 Colts play CBHS 2nd XV in their Championship semi final. Finals will be played on either the 6<sup>th</sup> for all grades or the 7<sup>th</sup> of August for Premier Colts if they make the final.



Netball continues until playoffs on the 20<sup>th</sup> of August, semi finals on the 27<sup>th</sup> of August and finals on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of

September. The premier A netball side have their semi finals on either Tuesday or Thursday the 23<sup>rd</sup> or 25<sup>th</sup> of August and finals will be held on the Wednesday the 31st of August.

As mentioned earlier the season has been compressed with the RWC and teams are about to hit semi finals. The U20 Colts side has qualified in 2<sup>nd</sup> place in section two and will take on CHBS 2<sup>nd</sup> XV in the Championship semi final at CBHS on the 30<sup>th</sup> of July at 2:45pm.

The Premier Colts are first equal with Christchurch and will play HSOB at Lincoln University on the 30<sup>th</sup> of July at 1:00pm for the Championship semi final. If they make the finals these will be held as the curtain raiser for the Senior Division 1 Trophy final on Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup> of August.

Unfortunately the playoff round for our Senior Division 2 team proved to be a tough ask. They will play HSOB on the 30<sup>th</sup> for the plate semi final at Bob Deans kicking off at 1:00pm.



The 1<sup>st</sup> XV have had a strong showing in the Plate section of Senior Division 1 competition. With a loss to Belfast 9 – 25 in the first match the team have not looked back with wins over Linwood 49 – 22, Shirley 44 -18 and in their latest match against Sumner they came back from being 19 – 0 down after ten minutes to win 30 – 27.

They took on Marist on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of July and went down 15–18 but remained in second place. They will now take on Burnside in the plate semi final at Burnside Park at 2:45pm. If they win they play in the plate final on the 6<sup>th</sup> of August and could finish the season 5<sup>th</sup> in the Metro competition which will be a great achievement.
