6. Vice Chancellors Report

The report was taken as read. The Vice Chancellor highlighted the following:

- Vice Chancellors met the incoming Tertiary Education Minister to discuss the Higher Education Funding Review. At that meeting it was disclosed that:
 - There is a possibility the PBRF funding round may be deferred.
 - There will be a movement of "free fees" from the first of study to the last year. Likely implementation in 2025.
 - The unified funding system will be replaced by the SAC funding model. This may have a modest uplift in revenue circa \$500,000 for the University.
 - The Children's University has 1475 members cross 45 schools and two Runanga and recently held a graduation ceremony.
 - The graduation destination and student experience surveys have recently been completed. Lincoln continues to sustain high levels of graduate employment within six months of graduation at 84%.

Lincoln University Vice-Chancellor's Monthly Report to Council

Month: 15 February 2024

It has been a positive start to the academic year, marked by an increase in activities as anticipation builds for the return of students to campus. The two-week period before the start of lectures on 21 February is a busy period with preparation week leading up to Rā Whakawhanaukataka Orientation Day and LUSA O'Week, including a Mihi Whakatau welcoming new students and staff to Lincoln on 19 February 2024. It is pleasing to note that while still early days, the University is tracking well towards our 2024 student EFTS targets and we expect to see numbers climb significantly over the next few weeks as students continue to confirm their enrolments.

Progress in our strategy update

We have made steady progress in updating our Strategy 2019-2028, looking ahead to our next strategic horizon from 2024-2028. Following input from Council, the Senior Leadership Team, Academic Board members, LU Tier-3 managers, and selected external stakeholders, the next step in our Communications and Engagement plan is to gather valuable insights and feedback from all staff that will assist in further refining the priorities and actions proposed. Interactive sessions have been scheduled with all staff members hosted by SLT and will be wrapped up in the first week of March with a series of drop-in sessions hosted by the Vice-Chancellor. This cascade process is leader-led with a focus on University-wide priorities, allowing the SLT to have an open dialogue with their teams and collate feedback within each of the areas. More specifically, it allows business units, faculties, divisions and departments to ensure alignment of individual plans to the strategy.

Rankings news

Welcome news at the start of the year revealed that the University retained its QS 5 Stars rating in the latest star rating released by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS). This is positive as the QS Stars Ratings are based on individual institutional performance rather than a comparison to other institutions. Pleasingly to note is in seven of the eight areas we were assessed we received 5 Stars including Teaching, Employability, Internationalisation, Research, Facilities and Environmental Impact.

In addition, the University has maintained its top 100 spot on the UI GreenMetric World University Rankings for the third consecutive year. This achievement is all the more notable given the sharp jump in universities engaging in the global sustainability ranking system, which has been operated by Universitas Indonesia (UI) since 2010. In 2023 a total of 1,183 universities from 84 countries participated in the UI GreenMetric ranking system, which rates each institution on their commitment and actions towards sustainability, based on six environmental sustainability indicators: Setting and Infrastructure, Energy and Climate Change, Waste, Water, Transportation, Education and Research. Lincoln University scored 8,425 points out of a maximum of 10,000 points, for an overall global ranking of 94th.

Sustainability

It is pleasing to report that the University announced the first round of funding from its new Sustainability Fund, sourced from a surcharge that applies to all air travel undertaken by University staff. The funding, totalling almost \$40,000, will contribute to a range of projects including the purchase of a WineCycler which transforms the waste product of the winemaking process into valuable garden fertiliser; travel funding for a 10-person cohort of Lincoln University soil scientists to take a low-carbon path to attend the New Zealand Society of Soil Science and Soil Science Australia Joint Conference (NZSSS); creation of a resource guide to assist academics in embedding sustainability into all of the University's courses and programmes; funding for LUSA, Lincoln Environmental Sustainability Society (LESS) and Sustainability Action Group for the Environment (SAGE) initiatives; and the purchase of a Peek app — a user-friendly online tool that provides an accessible and inclusive student-centred learning environment for field trips and other excursions.

Cycle 6 Academic Audit - site visit

Lincoln University submitted its Cycle 6 Self-review Portfolio to the Academic Quality Agency in early November 2023. The Audit Panel will visit the University on 4-6 March to interview members of the university community.

The Board was provided with information on the site visit. The purpose of the interviews is so the Audit Panel can find out how things happen, the extent to which the systems, processes and policies are fit for purpose and how well they work in practice. The interviews will also triangulate evidence which the Panel already has or to clarify where there might be differing points of view or experiences. Interviews are not usually intended to discover brand new information in a detailed way. Interviewees will be formally invited to attend and will be provided with a summary sheet and the full Self-review Portfolio.

Health and Safety Lag Indicators

The below lag data provides an overview of reported workplace incidents at the university (LU and Lincoln Agritech staff), with the exception of main CDP contracts where principal contractors have primary oversight of secure worksites (that data set is reported in the CDP H&S dashboard due to differences in contractor reporting periods).

November: Slight damage to Agritech vehicle backing into another vehicle, two restricted work injuries (AGLS) one a rib fracture, the other bruising/crushing of a hand while animal handling resulting in subtle fracture to little finger.

December: One lost-time injury, twisted knee.

January: Two significant near misses. A falling gum tree killed a sheep and damaged a fence on LURDF, and a metal plate came off card-controlled door in Waimarie grazing the head of a summer scholar as it fell from above the door they were exiting.

Total Recordable Injury Frequency Rate (LU and Agritech employees)



The above chart shows Total Recordable Injury (TRI) frequency per 200 000 hours worked by our staff. TRI is defined as reported work-place medical injuries, restricted work, lost time injuries, and fatal injuries. Using this measure, which has a wider scope than LTI, provides more detailed reporting on incidents and emerging risks. Note TRI includes any injuries that occur to staff while on the campus, even if not task/work-related.

Farms Health and Safety Audits

The Farm H&S Audits have been completed by the Farms Compliance and Training Officer. A list of corrective actions for each farm audit will be issued to the Farm Managers and a summary report will go to the Farms Committee of Council.

Health and Safety Critical Risk Elements

The Health and Safety team focus is to ensure that as an organisation we have robust assurances in place to evidence our management of health and safety, and bio-compliance. We undertake internal audits on a regular basis for our high-risk work areas (laboratories, workshops, farms, JML), along with regular inspections of construction and work sites (Property Group and Property Services). We commission external H&S professionals to audit different areas of the university where residual risk following mitigations remains medium to high.

We require reporting of all workplace incidents, events and safety observations to be entered into our health and safety management system (Risk Manager), via the OnSide app for our Farms, or the SAFELU app for students, visitors and contractors.

The following chart indicates current areas of LU critical risk for Health & Safety, and the residual risk where mitigation processes are in place.

Section 3 – Commentary for November and December 2023 and January 2024

Nov-23

Memorial Hall Ivey West (Cooks Brothers Construction)

One near miss occurred for this period. The site gate was left unlocked at end of the workday.

What controls were put in place to prevent these re-occurring?

Spoke to Site Manager who advised that two factors contributed to this event:

- i. The team working that day were distracted by a social event occurring later; and
- ii. a PM was left to lock up the site and had not done so before.

A process since has been put in place to prevent a reoccurrence of this.

Ross Building (Contract Construction)

One event occurred (water ingress into ceiling cavity after a night of heavy rain). FENZ Attended an alarm activation at 2am. Water had run through light fittings into both lecture rooms, pooling on seating and carpets, setting off alarms. An investigation is currently underway.

What controls were put in place to prevent these re-occurring?

Investigation still underway.

Burns Wing (Southern Demolition and Salvage)

One safety observation reported when a teenage boy was seen on the external emergency stairs at the 7th floor. This teen made his way back down the stairs and was then approached by a LU employee who inquired how he got there. The teen was then asked to leave the campus, which he did.

What controls were put in place to prevent these re-occurring?

Investigation is underway. Site Manager has been advised to ensure the gates are locked at all times during the demolition works.

Dec-23

Burns Wing (Southern Demolition and Salvage)

Tagging was seen on the 7th floor windows, the roof parapet and the lift house on the roof. Three different tags were observed with one tag painted several times. It is therefore assumed that three people were on the roof of Burns. Access had been gained by climbing up the south facing external emergency stairs. The investigation established that the tags related to known taggers operating in Christchurch city.

What controls were put in place to prevent these re-occurring?

The tags were covered by the lead PCBU then painted out. Site fencing was placed to block off the access stairway at ground level and another heavier duty lock and chain placed on the door leading to the roof. Going forward, ensure all sites are fully secure with all access to roofs blocked off with fencing in place at all times.

Biotron HV upgrade (Ventia)

This incident is of concern as the potential for injury to both staff and contractors was very high. No harm occurred due to the vigilance of the Ventia team working on the site that day. It was deemed so serious that the issue was discussed with both the H&S Manager and HR the day it was reported.

The Ventia team were working behind Biotron digging trenches from the tractor shed to end of Biotron building. This work was for placement of cables when a person (investigation established this was a LU Employee) moved fencing aside and walked into the "live" civil site where an excavator was in operation. The person approached the area and was seen in the blind spot (behind the machine). The spotter stopped work on seeing this person who was asked to leave the area. Fencing was put back into place and work resumed. Other fencing was checked later in the day.

What controls were put in place to prevent this event re-occurring?

The fencing was checked and secured. The team continued working behind a fully enclosed site, with gates closed. The person was interviewed to ascertain the reasons for moving fencing and walking into a live site. The Ventia team defined this as a high-risk event and requested follow-up occur immediately. The event was reported to the HR Business partner, the PM and the H&S Manager.

Biotron HV upgrade (unplanned joint sub-project between Connectics and Ventia)

When upgrading the Biotron, Connectics (also working on the campus) decided to trench and lay cable to connect from the electrical cable circuit on South Drive to the Biotron system to prevent digging up the area behind FRC later in the year. During this work, a water pipe was ruptured. This pipe was repaired later that day by FRC team members with no loss of productivity for students working the fields or the cable laying.

What controls were put in place to prevent this re-occurring?

This was an extra piece of unplanned work that was not included on the work methodology submitted initially. Consultation with FRC team before work started may have prevented this event.

Ross Building (Contract Construction)

Worker from temp agency of the lead PCBU, Contract Construction, working on the Ross building had child on campus. This child was seen wandering around while the worker worked on the roof of the Ross Building. Security re-connected the child with its parent and reminded the parent that no children were permitted on campus. This incident was deemed to be an opportunity for improvement.

What controls were put in place to prevent this re-occurring?

Ensure the lead PCBU inducts their workers, their subcontractors and their workers using the LU Sub-contractor form, so this topic is covered.

Jan-24

Forbes Stage 3 Refurbishment (Leighs Construction)

No formal report from Leighs Construction had been received when this report was written. The only incidents being reported on are the ones entered into Lincoln University system.

To 31 January 2024, five incidents had been reported and investigations are underway:

- 1 x Incident water ingress into elevator shaft
- 2 x SO (i) doorway left open/ exposed during night; and (ii) trip hazards in egress route

2 x NM - (i) cable arced when cut, and (ii) worker not wearing RPE when sanding concrete

Ross Building (Future Air)

Vehicle was observed parked across the pedestrian crossing on Farm Road, near YFC Hall. When asked they moved it.

What controls were put in place to prevent these re-occurring?

This incident was reported directly to the PM, with a copy of the event from the Risk Manager system.

Te Kete Ika (Air Tech)

Driver of vehicle was observed using a cell phone when driving on the campus.

What controls were put in place to prevent these re-occurring?

This incident was reported directly to the PM, with a copy of the event from the Risk Manager system.

NRE (City Care)

Two events reported for this contractor: (i) a vehicle was parked in loading / egress zone. And (ii) items left near the building external indicator board.

What controls were put in place to prevent these re-occurring?

These incidents were discussed with the team working that day.

5. Strategic and Policy Framework Implications
