



Te Whakapōtaetaka | Graduation



Te Whakapōtaetaka serves to mark the transition from student or undergraduate status to graduate or diplomate status, which accords membership of the University. The ceremony emphasises this in a number of different, but related, traditional ways, reflecting the long Western academic and Māori tradition.

At the start of the ceremony, after the academic procession has entered the stadium, there will be a pōwhiri, which is a formal Māori welcome. This serves to welcome the graduands and diploma or certificate recipients as fully-fledged members of the University community.

While most of those receiving awards will have entered the stadium before the pōwhiri, the doctoral graduands will represent all the groups when they enter in the traditional Māori manner during the pōwhiri. They will be called into the stadium by the kaikaranga from Kāi Tahu, the takata whenua (people of the land) of Lincoln University. This call is called a karanga. The call will be answered by a kaikaranga accompanying the graduands. The doctoral graduands will move slowly into the stadium while the karanga takes place.

A kaumātua (elder) of Kāi Tahu will then give a whakatuwheratanga (speech of blessing). This will be followed by the waiata (song), Te Wai Tuku Kiri, the words of which are to be found on page 6 of this programme.

During the singing of the waiata, one of the graduands will present the pounamu (greenstone). The pounamu symbolises the education that those receiving awards have undertaken. As rough pounamu is smoothed and polished, it gains in beauty. The pounamu used in the ceremony has one face polished while the remainder is in its natural state. The pounamu, which will sit at the front of the stage opposite the mace, represents the way in which the graduates or diplomates have been 'polished and elevated' by their education at Lincoln University, while also symbolising the potential in all of us for further learning and refinement.

During the ceremony, each recipient is called on to the stage by name. In the centre of the stage the Chancellor of the University will cap and shake hands with each graduand and diplomate to signify the conferment of the qualification. Those graduates with the trencher or bonnet as part of their regalia may then put that on their heads. Each recipient will then receive a handshake from the Vice-Chancellor before returning to his or her seat.

The parchment will be given offstage to the newly capped graduate. The parchment carries the University seal and certifies the conferral of the degree or award of the diploma or certificate.

After the degrees have been conferred and the diplomas and certificates awarded, the Chancellor calls all present to rise and sing the National Anthem, symbolising the part played by the University in the nation's life. Following this, the audience is asked to sing the medieval academic anthem, Gaudeamus, the words of which are to be found on page 7 of this programme.

The Esquire Bedel then takes the mace and leads the procession, graduates and diplomates from the stadium.

The audience is asked to remain standing until all the graduates and diplomates have left the stadium, as a mark of respect for their achievements.

Order of Proceedings



The Chancellor of Lincoln University, Bruce Gemmell, will preside over three whakapōtaetaka ceremonies. Each ceremony will be preceded by a procession of graduands, diploma/certificate recipients, University staff and Council members. The procession, led by the Esquire Bedel bearing the University mace, will march from the Christchurch Art Gallery, Te Puna o Waiwhetū, down Worcester Boulevard and along the Avon River, to the Christchurch Town Hall. On arrival at the Town Hall, award recipients and guests will take their seats in the stadium.

Academic Dress – The Tradition



In common with English universities, those in New Zealand have a system of academic dress which is worn by graduates to indicate their degree i.e. bachelor, master or doctor. This dress has evolved through the centuries from ordinary clothing. The gown was a medieval topcoat or cloak and the hood, a headcover.

The Lincoln University undergraduate diploma gown is black with green facings for agricultural diplomas, and black for all other diplomas.

The bachelor's gown is of Norman origin, the master's gown is of Tudor inspiration. The cap for all graduates other than the doctors is a black trencher with a tassel. Doctoral graduates wear a velvet bonnet. Gowns for Lincoln University degrees, except for doctorates, are black. The Lincoln University PhD gown is black with blue facings, while for higher doctorates, the gowns are red with facings of blue (Doctor of Science), gold (Doctor of Commerce) or green (Doctor of Natural Resources).

At Lincoln University, the different hood colours denote the different degrees.

Andrew Webster Macfarlane BAgrSc Lincoln

Doctor of Commerce *honoris causa*

Lincoln University alumnus Andrew Webster Macfarlane of 'Pencarrow', Mid Canterbury, has given a lifetime of service to farming, farm consultancy and roles in national and international agricultural organisations.

He is a practitioner, a leader and an inspiration in the primary sector, always open to innovative ideas, and renowned for boundless energy honed through years of trail running.

For the first 37 years of his career, after graduating from Lincoln University in 1981, he practised as a registered farm consultant, winning quick recognition as a dynamic and innovative professional.

Macfarlane Rural Business (MRB), co-founded with wife Tricia and Jeremy Savage, has through the years assisted numerous farmers to innovate and build their agricultural operations with resilience and sound foundations.

To this end, he encouraged the adoption of increased irrigation efficiency along with technologies relating to integrated forage, crop and animal husbandry systems that drove higher productivity while taking care of environmental management and stewardship. He has also devoted much time to farm family succession planning, including, where appropriate, assisting with off-farm investment to aid that succession.

The award of Life Membership of the New Zealand Institute of Primary Industry Management reflects the significant contribution he has made to the agricultural industry in New Zealand.

Through MRB, he has employed and trained farm consultants who themselves have gone on to make a difference across New Zealand agriculture.

Andy and Tricia developed their home farm, 'Pencarrow', in partnership with Andy's brother John, into a model property where agricultural science innovations are incorporated into modern farming practices. National and international visitors are shown how environmental best practice can lead to profitable farming.

'Pencarrow' won the Ballance Farm Environment award in 2003, and in 2007 Andy and Tricia were runners-up in the Lincoln Foundation Farmer of the Year awards. For the past 15 years of his career, Andy has had leadership and governance roles in New Zealand and internationally including serving on Lincoln University's governing body, the University Council, being President of the New Zealand Institute of Primary Industry Management and holding directorships with ANZCO, Ngai Tahu Farming, AgResearch, Fonterra and chairing Deer Industry NZ.

His abiding principle is that farming, research and education must work together for the common goal and purpose of sustainable long-term profitability in the primary production sector.

Andy has always been a leader with a unique ability to connect people and ideas. He is an alumnus of the prestigious Royal Agricultural University Leadership Development Programme and was the first non-UK citizen to be offered a place on this course. He is also an alumnus of Stanford University's Design Thinking Bootcamp programme.

As a member of the International Farm Management Association, Andy has presented at IFMA, and as a Fonterra ambassador to Global Dairy Platform. He has also attended United Nations' FAO annual conferences and COP28.



He has a detailed understanding of the challenges and opportunities agriculture faces from the New Zealand 'farm gate' via manufacturing to global customers.

As a loyal Lincoln University alumnus, proud and appreciative of his Lincoln University connections and affiliations, Andy never says no to assisting his university in whatever way requested.

The international ranking of London as the 'best city in the world' owes a not insignificant share of its global acclaim to Lincoln University landscape graduates and practitioners Sam Martin and Leighton Pace, principals of Exterior Architecture, one of Britain's leading landscape architecture companies.

Together they have contributed conspicuously to the transformation of many landmark London locations, with the 40-acre site of the iconic Battersea Power Station, and the huge 245 Hammersmith Road co-working facility just two of numerous examples.

The pair's work overseas more than meets the criteria for the Lincoln University Alumni International Medal, and the University Council is delighted to honour them with this award.

Founded by Sam Martin in 2003, and co-owned with Leighton Pace since 2012, London-based Exterior Architecture Ltd, has a staff of over 40 and the company works with external professionals and practitioners in architecture, engineering, interior design, lighting, product design and sculpture.

Leighton and Sam bring complementary strengths and areas of expertise to their professional partnership, which has seen them lift their company to the leading rank of British landscape design practices.

Leighton, originally from the West Coast, attended Westland High School, Hokitika.

He holds a BSc in Botany from Canterbury University as well as his Lincoln University qualifications, and is a Chartered Member of the Landscape Institute.

Localism and the endemic nature of place are key inspirations for Leighton's work, resulting in designs that reflect place, meaning and culture.

Leighton leads the practice's master planning and international work sectors across Europe, the Middle East and North Africa, and now more widely in Africa.

Earlier work by Leighton, before partnering with Sam, included the Stonehenge Environmental Project, a new regional hospital in Austria, a park in Berlin, and a new city district and public realm design in Beirut.

Sam says he takes his design inspiration from the concept of 'place' and the way in which people use that place, while always ensuring that the natural environment can express itself.

Originally from Peel Forest and a South Canterbury farming family, Sam attended Christ's College and after graduating from Lincoln University moved to London in 2001 where he has lived ever since with his wife and family.

Earlier work by Sam includes the New Zealand Garden in Savill Garden, Windson Great Park, one of Britain's greatest ornamental gardens which, through Sam's involvement, houses



one of the largest collections of native New Zealand plants in Britain. He is also a past Excellence Award winner for design work at the Chelsea Flower Show.

Exterior Architecture's landscaping work on the Battersea Power Station job, London's biggest regeneration project on the last remaining large riverfront development space in the central city, stands as one of the company's highest profile undertakings and it was completed to great acclaim.

The company's work on 245 Hammersmith Road, a 242,000 square foot collaborative co-working facility bringing together office space, retail units, roof terraces, a public plaza, urban park and event locations, won similar plaudits, and the development is referred to as the 'beating heart' of London's borough of Hammersmith.

Outside of London, the company's notable projects are numerous and include Harwell Campus, near Oxford, the UK's leading science and innovation campus. Exterior Architecture did the life science and campus landscapes.

The School of Landscape Architecture at Lincoln University is immensely proud of the career achievements of Sam Martin and Leighton Pace. They are remembered and known well.

The way they have taken their Lincoln training and education onto the global stage, working internationally and winning the appreciation of clients everywhere, merits the highest praise. But professionally more important than praise, their contributions to the betterment of the world's 'lived environment', and to daily human happiness and pleasure, achieved through their designs, fulfil the supreme essence of their calling as landscape architects and designers.

Working overseas and winning acclaim on the world stage makes Sam Martin and Leighton Pace very worthy recipients of Lincoln University's Alumni International Medal.

Bledisloe Medal



Dr Robyn Dynes is a Principal Scientist and farmer Engagement Specialist with AgResearch, Lincoln, who has made, and continues to make, an outstanding career contribution advancing New Zealand's landbased interests.

Additionally, as a Lincoln graduate, BAgrSc (Hons) 1985, PhD 1994, Dr Dynes has brought great reputational credit to her parent university.

Both these elements more than qualify her as a worthy recipient of Lincoln University's prestigious Bledisloe Medal.

Dr Dynes' science career, through which she has made her outstanding contributions to New Zealand agriculture and farming, has been at the interface of forage science and animal science, and her influence has been immense at the meeting point of the country's agricultural, scientific and political communities.

In a career spanning to date almost 35 years, Dr Dynes has worked for the betterment of the agricultural industry, helping to shape a world that benefits from greater understanding of the relationships between land, food and ecosystems. While farming activities and change practice are a central focus, her influence extends over many aspects of the 'rural-urban' divide, bringing together diverse communities of interest to achieve sustainable, sciencebased farming practices with beneficial outcomes for all New Zealand.

Dr Dynes' commitment to encouraging effective change management will have ongoing and enduring benefits as the primary sector continues to evolve.

Her recent research focuses on interactions between the emissions to air and water and agricultural systems, looking towards the changes in practice that will be needed by farmers to mitigate climate-change impacts and adapt to new realities and a 'new normal'.

Robyn is a scientist with outstanding communication skills, and is a past winner of the NZIAHS Sir Arthur Ward Trophy for Communication of Agricultural and Horticultural Science.

In 2023 she was appointed a Fellow of the New Zealand Institute of Agricultural and Horticultural Science.

Dr Dynes grew up on a sheep and beef farm in Southland and on a mixed cropping farm in Canterbury. After competing her Lincoln University degrees, Dr Dynes moved to the CSIRO in Western Australia and became a Senior Scientist with key national roles in the CRC for Salinity/Future Farm Systems.



She returned to New Zealand in 2004 and joined AgResearch. In addition to her AgResearch positions she led the Whitiwhiti Ora Land Use Suitability Programme which partnered with farmers and communities to deliver science with impact. She holds governance and research advisory roles across arable, sheep and beef and catchment groups across New Zealand.

Lincoln University is proud to add Dr Robyn Dynes to its pantheon of Bledisloe Medal recipients. She is the third woman to receive this outstanding award in the medal's 95-year history.

The Bledisloe Medal, initiated in 1930 by the late Viscount Bledisloe, former Governor-General of New Zealand, is made to a former student or a past or current staff member of Lincoln University, who in the opinion of the Council, has made an outstanding contribution to his or her chosen field of expertise, advanced New Zealand's interests, and/or brought credit to Lincoln University.

Prince Baah Annor Dean's List (PhD) *in Agricultural Economics and Management*

Adoption of food safety standards along fresh produce value chains have enhanced food guality and safety, increased market access of produce and improved environmental sustainability. However, adoption rates have been low among small-scale farmers mainly because of the associated high compliance costs. Prince's doctoral research investigates the determinants and impact of GlobalGAP standards adoption on cost of production and net income of small-scale pineapple farmers. The study provides nuanced policy options to promote smallholder food safety standards adoption. Study outcomes would also help policymakers to target interventions at the most important drivers of quality-enhancing compliance costs whilst making adoption more affordable to farmers and less expensive for taxpayers who fund these interventions.

Before commencing PhD studies at Lincoln University, Prince worked with Ghana's Ministry of Trade and Industry for close to a decade as a Senior Industrial Promotions Officer with oversight responsibility for analysing trade and industrial data for policy formulation and implementation. From his PhD thesis, Prince has published two research papers in the Agribusiness an International Journal and Agrekon. He is working on the third paper which is currently under review with the International Journal of Social Economics.

Prince has also served as a Teaching and Research Assistant at the Faculty of Agribusiness and Commerce, Lincoln University. Prince aspires to take up career positions in academia, public policy and international development.

Lucy Elms Bell Dean's List (PhD) in Soil Science

Lucy grew up on a sheep and beef farm in East Otago which motivated her PhD study investigating soil chemistry, aluminium solubility and legumes to support sustainable pastoral farming in the high country. Currently, soil acidity and associated aluminium toxicity are major constraints for legumes in high country grasslands.

Lucy investigated her research questions through a series of experiments including three field trials across Central Otago, a glasshouse experiment and a detailed investigation of soil chemistry. Among her findings, she revealed aluminium solubility in a high-country soil was controlled by organically bound aluminium. Furthermore, the differences in survival of 13 forage legume species assessed across field trial sites demonstrated the detrimental effect of climate on many legumes and highlighted Lotus pedunculatus and Trifolium incarnatum as key species of interest for farms in high country environments.

Before completing her doctorate at Lincoln University, she studied for her Bachelor of Agriculture Science (Hons) here and worked in the fertiliser industry. Lucy is currently farming and is looking to begin her career within the agriculture science industry.

Guanyu (Hanley) Chen Dean's List (PhD) *in Landscape Architecture*

Guanyu's research explores various dimensions of Landscape Performance Evaluation (LPE), encompassing its practice context, mechanism, evaluation strategies, approaches, and theories. His work offers a comprehensive framework for guiding future scholars, practitioners, and decision-makers in navigating LPE explorations, thereby contributing to the enhancement of the built environment and human well-being. Guanyu's PhD research has resulted in seven publications.

During his time at Lincoln, Guanyu has been actively involved in a variety of research projects, including the first New Zealand Case Study Investigation (CSI) project funded by the Landscape Architecture Foundation (LAF), USA, and a year-long research project funded by Our Land and Water National Science Challenge. These projects spanned a wide range of topics, ranging from urban agricultural landscape and landscape performance evaluation to design education and urban planning. Collectively, he has contributed to 10 academic publications during his time as a researcher at Lincoln beyond his PhD study.

Throughout his PhD journey, Guanyu also gained extensive teaching experience, working as a tutor for a diverse range of undergraduate and postgraduate courses. Additionally, he worked as a contracting landscape architect on industry projects, applying his academic expertise to real-world challenges. In his final PhD year, he also joined the Lincoln University Human Ethics Committee, where he reviewed research applications and provided feedback to serve the university's research community. After finishing his PhD in mid-2024 as a student, he reioined the School of Landscape Architecture team later the same year as a staff member. He is now a Lecturer at Lincoln University and has started supervising new PhD students.

Bowen Fan in Animal Science

Bowen studied the behavioural traits to identify subclinical diseases of grazing ruminants for his PhD research.

His main aim was to investigate behavioural changes as valuable parameters measured by commercial acceleration sensors under controlled challenge models of gastrointestinal nematodes (GIN), lipopolysaccharide (LPS), and toxins produced in endophyte-infected ryegrass to identify animal health status.

The key finding of his research is that the behavioural alterations of grazing ruminants induced by infection challenges have the potential to indicate the status of animal health. His research provides valuable information on the basis of the behavioural traits at pastures for farmers to implement accurate diagnosis to identify individual animals for early interventions to prevent severe infections on farms.

Bowen obtained a Bachelor's and a Master's Degree of Agricultural Science in Animal Medicine at Huazhong Agricultural University in China. Several years of working as a researcher on animal medicines aiming for diagnosis and prevention of diseases motivated Bowen Fan to carry out his doctoral research program in Lincoln University.

He sees a bright future ahead after completing his study and is keen to start his career within the scientific industry of New Zealand.

Ziqian Feng

in Food Biochemistry

Ziqian Feng's journey began with a Bachelor of Science in Nutrition in China. She then spent two years working in pharmaceutical clinical research before completing a Master of Science in Food Innovation at Lincoln University. These experiences led her to pursue a PhD at Lincoln University, where she investigated how to turn a food processing waste into a potential healthpromoting ingredient.

Her doctoral research focused on faba bean blanching water - the liquid leftover from blanching (boiling) faba beans, which is usually discarded. She analysed its composition and discovered that it contains bioactive compounds with cholesterollowering properties. Specifically, she found that this water can inhibit HMG-CoA reductase, a key enzyme involved in the body's cholesterol production, and reduce cholesterol synthesis. It also reduces cholesterol micellization activity, which is an essential step for cholesterol absorption. These findings suggest that repurposing this liquid could help manage cholesterol levels and benefit cardiovascular health.

Beyond its health benefits, Ziqian demonstrated that faba bean blanching water also has desirable functional properties for food formulation. It can absorb water and act as an emulsifier, making it a useful ingredient in plant-based and "clean-label" recipes in bakery production. By turning a processing by-product into a value-added ingredient, her research helps reduce food waste and opens up new possibilities for sustainable food innovation.

Ziqian is currently preparing her PhD findings for publication in scientific journals. She is also expecting her first baby. In the long term, she plans to build her career in the New Zealand food industry, applying her expertise to develop healthy and sustainable food products.

Dilini Chavika Fernando *in Finance*

Chavika Fernando's extensive experience as an accountant in multinationals and large companies, such as Chevron and Empower motivated her on embarking on doctoral research examining the relationship between corporate governance and firm performance. She explored how national governance factors influence firm performance, finding a positive correlation. Her study focused on ASEAN countries from 2010 to 2019, analysing 2,385 firm-year observations. The research revealed that various control variables significantly impact firm performance.

From a theoretical perspective, her work contributes valuable insights into how corporate governance affects firm performance and highlights the importance of governance systems in ASEAN-6 nonfinancial listed firms. Practically, the study identifies the optimal structure of corporate governance that enhances performance while also examining the moderating effects of board effectiveness, block ownership, national governance, and other factors on firm performance in ASEAN-6 non-financial listed firms.

Chavika holds a Bachelor's degree in Commerce and a Master's degree in Business Administration and is currently pursuing her Chartered Professional Accounting (CPA) credentials. She was an Accountant with the world's largest district cooling company -Emirates Central Cooling Systems Corporation (Empower) before she embarked on her doctoral research. She has extensive accounting experience in Sri Lanka and the United Arab Emirates, along with over two years of experience in New Zealand. She is currently attached to the accounts department at ReoFab in Christchurch, where she plays a key role in managing the accounts of ReoFab's Christchurch and Wellington branches.

Looking ahead, after completing her studies, Chavika is eager to advance her career in management accounting across various industries in New Zealand.



Julie Danielle Gillespie in Soil Science

Julie applied a transdisciplinary research approach to soil science as part of the Food Transitions 2050 Joint Postgraduate School. Her aim was to understand the connections between soil, food, and people in the context of Aotearoa New Zealand, and how weaving together different knowledges in a transdisciplinary research approach can help to achieve this.

Her research utilises a case study approach in bringing together mātauraka Māori and soil science to study horticultural land use by Māori at a bay on Te Pātaka o Rākaihautū Banks Peninsula with the purpose of understanding how this knowledge can be applied in a complementary and additive way. Following this was the development of a holistic framework for identifying the connections and disconnections between soil, food, and people in modern food production systems in Aotearoa New Zealand.

Her research weaves soil science, social science, and mātauraka Māori to investigate and understand how to do transdisciplinary research for achieving soil and food security. Her findings serve as a guide to other soil science researchers, as she also identified areas of weaknesses to be prioritised when addressing soil and food security.

Before starting her PhD, Julie completed a Bachelor of Science (Land, Water, and Environment) degree and a Master of Science in Soil Physics at Lincoln University.

She is now applying all of what she learned from her time at Lincoln University as a Land Resources Scientist at Environment Canterbury.

Brittany Jacqueline Graham *in Wildlife Management*

Brittany Graham began her academic journey at Lincoln University with a Bachelor of Science before advancing to a Master's program. Due to the significance of her research, she was given the opportunity to upgrade to a PhD, allowing her to expand her work in pest management and conservation. Her doctoral research focused on optimising ground-based pest control by integrating traditional tools, such as traps, with innovative attractants, including audio, visual, and foodbased lures.

This approach aimed to improve the effectiveness of pest control operations, particularly against invasive mammalian species threatening New Zealand's unique biodiversity.

Brittany's work has the potential to revolutionise pest management by enhancing the efficiency of control methods, aligning with New Zealand's Predator Free 2050 initiative. Her contributions have been recognized through substantial funding from Predator Free 2050 Limited, underscoring the value of her research in conservation. She is currently in the process of publishing her findings to inform and inspire further advancements in the field.

Katrin Gabriela Hewitt

in Insect Biological Control

Kati has spent over 15 years in agricultural research, focusing on pasture and forage science. She holds a Bachelor of Science from Hochschule Weihenstephan in Germany, as well as a Postgraduate Diploma and Master's in Agricultural Science with distinction from Massey University. Her career includes roles such as R&D Scientist at Biolumic, where she developed UV treatments for horticultural crops, and at Plant & Food Research, where she specialized in analytical chemistry.

Kati's PhD focused on how environmental challenges—such as climate change and human-driven changes in soil nutrients affect the interactions between insect pests and pasture grasses infected with beneficial Epichloë endophytes. Her work demonstrated that drought make grasses more attractive to pests, like root aphids and African black beetles, while phosphorus fertilization can reduce the survival of grass grubs, improving pasture growth and resilience. Her work highlights the vital role of Epichloë endophytes in maintaining pasture health under challenging environmental conditions.

Now, as a Scientist in the Plant-Insect Interactions team at AgResearch, Kati continues to advance her research on pasture health, pest management, and the role of Epichloë endophytes. Her long-term career goal is to establish herself as a plantinvertebrate interactions scientist, focusing on improving pasture resilience and pest management in response to climate change.

Jamaltul Nizam Bin Shamsuddin Dean's List (PhD)

in Finance

After working for over 10 years as Head of Corporate Services in the insurance industry, Jamaltul was motivated to investigate the impact of new entrants into the insurance industry in Malaysia as his doctoral project.

Jamaltul's investigations focused on the growth of InsurTech companies in Malaysia and whether this will positively or negatively affect the firm performance and the financial sustainability of incumbent insurance and takaful operators. Besides this his research also focused on if the incumbent insurance company and takaful operator need to invest in technologies parallel with the InsurTech companies?

His research provides valuable information for incumbent insurance companies and takaful operators in Malaysia to consider the investment into technologies, to align the firm business plan and strategies with the growth of digitisation and to the government in strengthening the monetary policy (interest rate) and fiscal policy (taxation) to ensure the sustainability of insurance companies in Malaysia.

Jamaltul holds a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting and a Master's in Islamic Finance and Banking. He holds a Malaysian Chartered Accountant, ASEAN Chartered Accountant and is an Associate member of Australia CPA. He has extensive experience overseas and in New Zealand and is currently a Finance and Admin Manager at Canterbury Refugee Resettlement and Resource Centre. His current role is a unique opportunity to be a small part of a great team helping people in Canterbury, as he has a passion for assisting organisations in the NGO sector.

Jamaltul sees a bright future after finishing his study and is keen to continue working in financial, management and academic roles in different industries in New Zealand.

Nadeesha Kumari Jayasinghe Dean's List (PhD) *in Animal Science*

Before starting her PhD at Lincoln University, Nadeesha completed a Bachelor's degree in Agricultural Technology and Management at the University of Peradeniya in Sri Lanka. She then moved to the USA to pursue a Master of Science in Dairy Production at South Dakota State University, before relocating to New Zealand for her PhD studies.

Her PhD research focused on identifying the drivers of voluntary intake in sheep fed low dry matter forages commonly found in the New Zealand pastoral system. The findings provide valuable insights for improving animal production while also mitigating environmental pollution caused by excess nitrogen leaching into the soil. Due to the novelty of her research, the examiners recommended her thesis for the Dean's List.

Sameerah Kashif Dean's List (PhD) in Accounting

Before beginning her PhD, Sameerah was a student pursuing a Master's degree in Professional Accountancy from the University of London. Her master's research focused on sustainability standards, particularly in the



context of the evolving role of accountants in the digital world. This research inspired her to delve deeper into the field of sustainability reporting through doctoral-level studies.

Her doctoral research focused on how companies communicate with the public regarding what they're doing to protect the environment, contribute to society, and run their businesses responsibly. Sameerah examined the quality of sustainability reports published by listed companies. She specifically investigated if these reports present information in a neutral and unbiased manner or if companies employ strategies to create and manage corporate impressions by emphasizing good company performance and downplaying poor company performance.

Her research is significant because it helps ensure that companies are transparent and accountable when they share information about their sustainability practices. This is important for all the stakeholders including investors, customers, and the community to make informed decisions. By improving how sustainability information is reported, it is possible to encourage businesses to be more responsible and take meaningful action on critical global issues like climate change and social equity.

Sameerah is currently involved in curriculum development and teaching at Pacific International Hotel Management School (PIHMS) in New Zealand. Her long-term goal is to become a leading academic and researcher in sustainability accounting. She aspires to bridge the gap between academic research and industry practices, creating impactful strategies for companies to address today's complex sustainability challenges.

Jacobus Christiaan Kok in Animal Science

Jacobus completed his PhD in Animal Science at Lincoln University, where his thesis focused on reducing nitrogen loss from cow urine patches in pasture-based dairy systems. His research examined the relationship between urine volume, patch area, and nitrogen leaching risk from cow urine patches. While cow urine patches are a significant source of nitrogen loss, there was limited research on how these factors influenced nitrogen leaching.

Jacobus's work aimed to better understand this relationship and explore how grazing management strategies could affect urine nitrogen load and plant nitrogen uptake to help reduce leaching risk. The research also involved developing a tool to predict the impact of these strategies on nitrogen loss from urine patches.

Jacobus has presented his findings at several conferences and published in journals such as the Journal of New Zealand Grasslands and the New Zealand Journal of Agricultural Science.

Looking ahead, Jacobus plans to continue exploring sustainable agricultural practices and pursue a career in the commercialisation of Agritech. He currently works at a startup company in Dunedin.

Matiwalage Iresha Nirmalie Wickramanayake

in Food Science and Technology

Before starting her PhD journey at Lincoln University, Iresha built a strong academic foundation in chemistry and food science. Iresha first earned her Bachelor's degree in Chemistry from the Institute of Chemistry, Sri Lanka, followed by a Master's in Food Science and Technology from the Postgraduate Institute of Agriculture at the University of Peradeniya, Sri Lanka. After moving to New Zealand, Iresha further expanded her expertise by completing a Postgraduate Diploma in Applied Sciences at Lincoln University.

Iresha's PhD research explored the bio accessibility of grape phenolics in association with milk proteins. Her findings highlighted the potential of casein as a carrier for delivering grape phenolic compounds, opening new possibilities for developing functional dairy products enriched with the health benefits of grape phenolics. Due to the novelty of Iresha's research, her work makes a valuable contribution to the field.

Leanne Maria McAllum

Dean's List (PhD) in Sociology

Maria chose to study Dyspraxia or Developmental Coordination Disorder (DCD) in adults because Dyspraxia is not well understood in Aotearoa New Zealand and internationally in social environments.

The primary purpose of her research was to investigate the lived experience of the Dyspraxia population in adults and to help address the lack of 'voice' of the Dyspraxia population.

A key finding was that the biomedical model and the subsequent social response are not representative of the lived experiences of study participants. Alternate ways of conceptualising Dyspraxia, such as the social model of disability, including the concept of neurodivergence, and the capabilities approach, focusing on social well-being, can enhance current institutional responses and promote equity significantly.

Before her doctorate, Maria completed a Postgraduate Diploma in policy and planning at Lincoln University. She then pursued her doctoral research part-time while working full-time at Hohepa Canterbury, where she helped people with disabilities live their best lives.

Maria looks forward to her new role running her own business in the disability sector and continuing to work in the community.

Lydia Prentiss Michela in Disaster Risk Management

Lydia investigated the resilience of tourists and recreationists to natural hazards while recreating in conservation areas of New Zealand. Conservation areas include national parks, reserves and other areas. Many areas popular with recreationists are also vulnerable to natural hazards such as severe weather, landslides, earthquakes, or volcanoes. Her main aim was to understand what resilience meant for individuals in these contexts and how the resilience of individuals was affected or influenced by the system around them.

She sent out a national survey online to recreationists and interviewed recreationists and stakeholders. She sought to understand how recreationists perceived natural hazards, how they prepared for trips, what their experience had been with hazards, and how they perceived responsibility for their safety. She found resilience had four dimensions: awareness, preparedness, adaptive capacity and perception of responsibility. She also found that where tourists came from (their origin context) and their previous recreation experience played a significant role in how resilient they were (or not).

Prior to her doctoral research, Lydia was actively engaged in running a small family business with her husband and involved with multiple community service groups, including the Mid-Canterbury TimeBank and her local church congregation. Lydia holds a Bachelor's degree in Geography and Arabic from Brigham Young University, USA. She moved to Christchurch in 2017 to pursue a Master of Disaster Risk and Resilience from the University of Canterbury and graduated with Distinction.

Lydia is currently working as a research consultant/analyst ResOrgs in Christchurch, conducting research and analysis on organisational resilience, operational resilience, and risk management across the 4Rs (reduction, readiness, response and recovery).

Neleesha Shanthirathna Muthukumarana Hewa Thondilege Dean's List (PhD) *in Finance*

After completing her finance undergraduate degree in Sri Lanka, Neleesha moved to New Zealand to further her studies. Driven by a strong passion for financial research, she pursued a research-focused master's in Finance at Lincoln University. Following the completion of her master's, Neleesha's interest in finance deepened, leading her to pursue a PhD in Finance. Within three years and a few months of dedicated study, she successfully earned her PhD and was honoured with the prestigious Dean's List Award.

Neleesha believes that investors have the power to make a positive impact on the environment, society, and governance. Driven by this belief, she decided to pursue her PhD in socially responsible investment funds. Socially Responsible Investment (SRI) is an investment strategy that considers social, ethical and environmental elements in investment. SRIs have grown into a widely followed investment practice offering a variety of products to investors. The fund industry is more focused on embracing sustainability practices in its operations.

In her study, she analysed the performance persistence of SRI funds to test whether SRI funds consistently perform well during different market conditions. She also explored whether the internal and external factors of SRI funds have an impact on the performance persistence of SRI funds. Her research provides valuable information for investors, analysts, portfolio managers and institutions.

Looking ahead, Neleesha sees a bright future after finishing her studies and is eager to continue her research work in collaboration with universities and industries in New Zealand and worldwide.

Peter Brent Nahkies in Social Science

Brent Nahkies began his working life training as a property valuer with the government, becoming a Registered Valuer in 1982. After working as a valuer, he took up an appointment as a lecturer at Lincoln University in 1984. His research interest was in preserving heritage buildings and the resultant impacts on private property rights. This was also a subject he studied at Texas (A & M) University while completing a Masterate in Land Economics and Real Estate in 1991.

In 1998 he left Lincoln University to set up his own property consultancy firm specialising in the valuation and management of heritage buildings and provided advice to owners, developers, local governments, and Heritage New Zealand. He returned to Lincoln University in 2011, taking up an appointment as a Senior Lecturer in Property, which he held until 2020.

Brent was motivated to do his research by the Christchurch earthquakes and the resulting loss of heritage buildings. He was familiar with the challenge of retrofitting earthquake-prone heritage buildings due to his early academic research and subsequent consulting work. Brent saw a need to improve the seismic safety of existing buildings while encouraging the conservation of heritage buildings in sustainable ways that also protected private property rights.

Current legislation that requires the mandatory retrofitting of earthquake-prone buildings is leading to a significant loss of heritage buildings and negatively impacting provincial towns in New Zealand while also causing financial hardship for many building owners. In recognition of these problems the Government is undertaking a major review of the legislation and management of earthquake-prone buildings in New Zealand. Brent is keen to see his research used in this review in the hope that better outcomes will be achieved in terms of both seismic safety and heritage building conservation by making building seismic retrofits affordable for owners and feasible for provincial towns.

Chrystal Te Ohorere O'Connor Dean's List (PhD) in Food Biochemistry

Dr. Chrystal Te Ohorere O'Connor (Ngāti Hauā, Ngāti Paoa) grew up in Waikato, Cambridge. She is a food biochemist and early-career academic passionate about mātauranga Māori and sustainable food systems. Before embarking on her doctoral research at Lincoln University, she completed a Master of Science in Animal Science and



Biochemistry degree, for which she was awarded with a Distinction and also spent time teaching English in China.

Her PhD research explored native Aotearoa insects as a sustainable protein source, investigating Mātauranga Māori on traditional insect consumption, and perspectives on eating them now and into the future. She also examined insects that can be reared sustainably and how different diets and insect life stages impact their nutritional composition. She examined how rakau rongoā (medicinal plants) can enhance the nutritional and health-promoting properties of edible insects. Her research found that native caterpillar species contain impressive protein and mineral profiles, particularly when fed kawakawa and mānuka. These findings contribute to the development of high-value functional foods, supporting food sovereignty, environmental sustainability, and indiaenous food systems.

Now a lecturer at Lincoln University, Dr. O'Connor continues to research sustainable food systems and value-added foods that contribute to healthier and environmentally conscious food practices. She is passionate about mentoring rangatahi (young people), encouraging them to develop their own thinking and perspectives on how to create sustainable food systems in Aotearoa New Zealand.

Aghogho Ohwofasa Dean's List (PhD) *in Molecular Biosciences*

Increasingly, our ability to undertake climate mitigation relies on our deep understanding of how microbes engage, influence and drive fermentation, and how these processes are influenced by climatic and/or environmental factors. In his research, Aghogho set out to understand microbial dynamics of different types of fermentation. Results uncovers the roles of different taxa as fermentation engineers in different products and how this is interlinked with their ability to manipulate key abiotic features of the fermented product. Altogether, the microbial communities not only change the large biochemical characteristics, but also the organoleptic compounds that may be present in small amounts. Even though, sometimes, these changes may not be perceptible to humans.

These results contribute towards building a deeper knowledge base on the diverse and complex fermentation microbial communities and their functions. These findings help to understand which fractions of the fermentation microbial communities may be more vulnerable to change, with our changing climate. Climate mitigation through improvement of our production practices needs to account for the impacts of climatic variables on the microbes that underpin all fermentation.

Before embarking on his doctoral studies here at Lincoln University, Aghogho completed a Bachelor of Science (Hons) degree in Biochemistry from Nigeria. Via the Queen Elizabeth Commonwealth Scholarships (QECS), he gained a Master's degree in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology from COMSATS University. Aghogho is presently looking to launch his career in the New Zealand's scientific community.

Abraham Nii Adoteye Saka Dean's List (PhD) *in Economics and Finance*

Abraham's research explored the trajectory of financial inclusion among Ghanaian

households. First, the study developed a multidimensional financial inclusion index using both banking and insurance data to assess the key drivers of financial inclusion in Ghana. Second, it examined the relationship between financial inclusion, poverty, and income inequality, highlighting its broader socioeconomic impact. Third, the study analyzed the link between women's empowerment and financial inclusion, investigating how different dimensions of empowerment influence access to financial services. Lastly, it reviewed Ghana's digital financial inclusion ecosystem, assessing its role in expanding financial accessibility. Abraham's findings indicate that financial inclusion improved significantly over the study period, positively impacting household well-being and women's empowerment. Additionally, digital financial inclusion emerged as a key enabler, playing a crucial role in advancing financial access and inclusion efforts across the country.

Abraham is a chartered banker and a gualified public and financial accountant. holding a PhD in Economics and Finance. He has extensive experience in teaching and research across finance, accounting, banking, and economics, complemented by a strong background in the financial services industry. In academia, Abraham has taught and supervised dissertations at the bachelor's and master's levels in various universities in Ghana and abroad. He has also served as a guest lecturer at universities worldwide, including in France. Professionally, Abraham has held diverse leadership and operational roles, including platform enablement lead, capability lead, subject matter expert, tester, business analyst, project manager, and bank manager. His expertise extends

to transformative projects, most notably leading the development and implementation of a new Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system, which automated business processes, improved operational efficiency, and streamlined organizational workflows. In addition, Abraham has worked as a financial and accounting consultant for firms in Ghana and New Zealand, providing strategic insights and expertise. His blend of academic excellence and practical industry experience positions him as a highly skilled professional in finance, banking, and economic systems innovation. Abraham envisions a bright future and is eager to continue working in education, including teaching, research, and educational leadership, or in financial and economic research roles across various industries. He is open to opportunities in New Zealand, Ghana, and globally, where he can leverage his expertise to drive innovation and impact in finance, economics, and education.

Samuel Tigistu Seba

in Agribusiness Systems

Samuel is an accomplished agribusiness professional with a deep commitment to addressing the challenges hindering the growth of the agribusiness sector in Ethiopia and other emerging economies. In his PhD research, titled Improving the Performance of Fresh Value Chains (FVCs) in Economic Development and Food and Nutrition Security, Samuel explored the systemic issues plaguing agricultural value chains in Ethiopia.

Through an extensive literature review, Samuel identified a critical lack of investment across these fresh value chains. The research drew on prominent theories to identify factors influencing investment decisions. To better understand these dynamics, he developed gualitative and guantitative System Dynamics (SD) models of the Avocado Value Chain (AVC) in Ethiopia that are informed by field observations, in-depth semi-structured interviews, and group model-building workshops. The qualitative System Dynamics model revealed several feedback loops operating in adverse directions perpetuating low incomes for actors and limited availability of affordable fruits, primarily driven by high post-harvest losses and insufficient investment incentives. Comprising all these feedback loops, the simulated quantitative System Dynamics model also revealed these persistent challenges. Samuel proposed a coherent set of 11 interventions, which, when simulated, demonstrated robust positive impacts across all scenarios. These findings provide valuable strategic insights into agribusinesses and can serve as a foundation for dialogue on building effective value chains in emerging economies.

Samuel holds a Bachelor's in Agribusiness Management, an MBA from Ethiopia, and a Master of Commerce (Agricultural), First Class Honours from Lincoln University. With over 10 years of experience in agribusiness research, consulting and practice in Ethiopia and New Zealand, he currently works as a quality control specialist at Turner & Growers, New Zealand's largest fruit and vegetable distributor. Passionate about transforming agrifood value chains, Samuel aims to implement his research findings to drive meaningful change in Ethiopia's agricultural sector to improve food and nutritional security.

Sarawoot Somin

in Computational Biology

Sarawoot has a true passion for computational biology and drug design. After spending several years on postgraduate degrees in computer science and bioinformatics, including working in area of software industries, he is excellent at identifying and analysing problems and developing a solution to address various problems in different environments.

Sarawoot used computer simulations to explore molecular interactions between an enzyme (IDE) and toxic plaques in the brain at atomic and quantum levels. This understanding provides the crucial information in explaining enzyme activity, potentially leading to new ways to fight Alzheimer's disease and improve brain health.

Pharmaceutical companies could use his research to develop better IDE activators or inhibitors, which could help not only in Alzheimer's but also in other diseases where IDE plays a role. Al, his research helps to understand how enzymes function under different temperatures and different pressures, which is valuable in various biomedical and pharmaceutical applications.

Sarawoot is currently working for an aerospace engineering company as a software architect, integrating technologies to simulate the protein structure in space. Growing protein (protein crystallisation) in space and computer simulation could become a key part of pharmaceutical research and drug design in the near future. The role is a great opportunity for him to follow his passion for the computational biology and drug design.

Limin (Ashley) Sui in Food Science

Before beginning her doctoral research, Ashley gained valuable industry experience as a Product Technologist at Gaea Nutritional Foods Limited and an R&D Technician at PepsiCo Asia Research & Development Center. In these roles, she contributed to the development and marketing of new food products, optimized formulations, and ensured that quality and safety standards were met throughout the manufacturing process.

Ashley's PhD research at Lincoln University focused on improving the nutritional and functional properties of rice crackers by incorporating oyster and mussel protein powders. She explored how adding seafood-derived proteins could enhance the digestibility of rice-based snacks while providing health benefits such as antioxidant and anti-inflammatory properties.

This research is significant for the food industry because it offers a solution for creating healthier, protein-enriched, glutenfree snack options. The outcomes of her work help food manufacturers develop functional foods that promote better health and meet consumer demand for alternative, high-protein snacks. Additionally, the incorporation of seafood proteins contributes to sustainability by adding value to seafood byproducts.

Currently, Ashley works as a Product Technologist at Quality Foods Southland, focusing on product improvements and new product development. Looking ahead, she aims to contribute to the food industry by advancing innovative, nutritious, and sustainable food products. Her goal is to work in research and development or quality assurance, where she can apply her expertise to improve food formulations, enhance product safety, and introduce healthier options to the market.

Alice Jane Sacheverell Tansell Dean's List (PhD) in Conservation and Ecology

Working in conservation inspired Jane to investigate systematic camera trapping for kiwi monitoring as her doctoral project. Jane's research aimed to develop a new noninvasive method suitable for kiwi population monitoring, including being capable of detecting non-vocal juveniles. The camera trap method is a significant improvement because of its ability to detect population increase more quickly than traditional call counts. This will help managers better understand the response of kiwi populations to pest control operations.

Before embarking on her PhD, Jane spent 18 years working in conservation, principally in New Zealand. As a detector dog handler, she also worked on two of the largest successful island pest eradications undertaken internationally, on Macquarie and South Georgia Islands.

Jane is currently working as a dairy assistant, while also continuing to pursue her passion as a part-time conservation contractor. She continues to be involved in kiwi monitoring and management as well as provide kiwi detector dog services.

Thinzar Soe Myint in Plant Science

As an Assistant Lecturer at Yezin Agricultural University in Myanmar, Thinzar sought to enhance her academic and research skills—not only for personal growth but also to contribute to the development of her home country. Recognising the need for improvement in Myanmar's pastoral sector, she chose to study pasture production at Lincoln University in New Zealand.

Thinzar's PhD research focused on determining the optimal proportions of pasture species, amounts of seeds, and nitrogen (N) fertiliser for temperate grassland systems, specifically under irrigated conditions and existing N limitations. Her field experiments at Lincoln University included ten monocultures and mixtures of perennial ryegrass, white clover, and plantain, repeated at two sowing rates and two levels of nitrogen fertiliser. This study also provided essential scientific insights into seed mixture formulation based on crop physiology principles.

The knowledge Thinzar gained in crop physiology during her PhD led to an opportunity as a Postdoctoral Fellow working on wheat crops at Lincoln University, where she continues her research after completing her PhD. Her long-term career goal is to make significant contributions to the agricultural industry as a Plant Scientist specializing in crop physiology, both in New Zealand and Myanmar.

Meriam Seth Toalak

Dean's List (PhD) in Plant Protection

Meriam's research focused on studying and identifying Phytophthora species in New Zealand apple orchards. Her main goal was to determine the Phytophthora species that were associated with apple orchards in New Zealand including exploring their genetic diversity and assess whether any of the commonly used apple rootstocks were resistant to these pathogens. She also evaluated the effect of two commercial microbial treatments on the susceptibility of two apple rootstocks to Phytophthora cactorum.

Prior to completing her PhD, Meriam employed at Biosecurity Vanuatu in the Plant Health section before serving as Director Biosecurity for five years, including two years in an acting capacity. She was also the developing country expert for the Asia-



Pacific region at the Standards and Trade Development Facility (STDF) of the World Trade Organization (WTO) for two years. More recently, she conducted a review of two agricultural strategies and the Overarching Productive Sector Policy for the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Forestry, Fisheries and Biosecurity under the European Development Fund (EDF11). Additionally, Meriam holds a Master's degree in Plant Health and Biosecurity from the University of Adelaide, South Australia.

The key finding of her research was the identification of the Phytophthora species associated with New Zealand orchards, including the identification of a new Phytophthora species record for New Zealand.

Yanyu Zhang

in Food Science

Yanyu's passion for sustainable food systems and improving human health inspired her doctoral research on the potential of pea cooking water (PCW). PCW is a nutrient-rich by-product of pea processing. PCW often discarded as waste. It contains valuable proteins and bioactive compounds that can be repurposed to create healthier and more sustainable food products.

Yanyu focused on incorporating PCW into pasta to enhance its nutritional profile and reduce its glycaemic response. PCW is proving as a promising option for individuals managing blood sugar levels, such as those with diabetes or at risk of metabolic disorders. The research also examined how different incorporation concentration of PCW affect the functionality and digestibility of PCW, ensuring its suitability for industrial applications. The findings of this research have significant implications for both human health and the food industry. By repurposing PCW, the study promotes the reduction of food waste while addressing the growing demand for functional foods. The development of lowglycaemic pasta offers a practical dietary solution for managing diabetes and improving overall metabolic health.

Yanyu holds a Master of Science and is currently working in an R&D department in the food industry. She aspires to continue advancing sustainable food innovations that benefit human health, reduce environmental impact, and address global challenges such as food waste and chronic disease prevention.
