

IAN AND KIRSTY BURNETT UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

1. Background



Ian Burnett (1924 - 2018) attended Lincoln from 1957-1961 (Diploma of Agriculture with distinction, 1959; Diploma of Agricultural Engineering with Honours, 1960) and then settled in Gisborne. He worked for the Poverty Bay and East Cape Catchment Board and then managed Burnett and Riach, a tile draining contracting firm. He and wife Margaret developed a small citrus orchard and raised a family. In the late 1980s Ian undertook some short-term tutoring roles back at Lincoln.

Daughter Kirsty Burnett attended Lincoln in the mid-1980s, graduating with Bachelor of Agricultural Science in May 1987. Kirsty was Lincoln College Students Association (LCSA) President in 1985 and 1986.

Ian was involved in the International Student club and was LCSA Vice-President in 1958. Both were awarded the George Wright Cup for 'Contributing the most to the student life of the University'.

2. Purpose

The Ian and Kirsty Burnett Undergraduate Scholarship was established in 2024 by Kirsty Burnett to support students who are entering their second year of study towards a Bachelor of Agriculture, Bachelor of Agriculture Science, Bachelor of Commerce (Horticulture) or Bachelor of Viticulture and Oenology degree or entering a Diploma in Farm Management or Diploma in Horticultural Management at Lincoln University.

3. Number/Value/Commencement

Starting from academic year 2025, a total of three scholarships will be offered to full time students studying at Lincoln University. The intention is to offer one scholarship per year over a three-year period, but consideration can be given to awarding two scholarships in the same year.

The annual value of each scholarship shall be \$8,000 towards tuition fees.

4. Eligibility

Applicants must be full time students entering:

- their second year of their Bachelor of Agriculture, Bachelor of Agriculture Science, Bachelor of Commerce (Agricultural or Horticulture) or Bachelor of Viticulture and Oenology degree, or
- a Diploma in Farm Management or Diploma in Horticultural Management.

Applicants must be New Zealand Citizens or Permanent Residents.

5. Selection Criteria

The criteria for selection will be

- Hardship barriers making continuing study difficult
- Academic Merit (all first-year courses completed successfully)¹
- Evidence of and/or planned activity to support the New Zealand Agriculture or Horticulture industries.

6. Selection Committee

The scholarship shall be awarded based on a recommendation of a selection committee which shall comprise:

- The convenor of the Scholarships Committee, or nominee
- A representative from the Faculty of Agriculture and Life Sciences
- Kirsty Burnett, or nominee.

The selection committee may request the applicant to attend an interview as part of the selection process. The selection committee may refrain from making an award if it finds no candidate of sufficient merit.

7. Tenure

The scholarship is tenable for one year; however, scholarship holders may reapply in subsequent years. The scholarship is tenable with any other scholarship, award or bursary that permits this.

8. Application

Applications close on **31 March**.

¹ While grades are not to be given paramount importance, higher pass marks of Bs versus Cs will be looked on favourably.
