

Peter Wallace Johnstone Memorial Scholarship

Background

Peter Wallace Johnstone was born into a King Country farming family and apart from attending St Peters School, Cambridge and Kings College, Auckland he spent all his life there. After leaving school he spent a year working for the BNZ in Te Kuiti then began his farming career on the family farm at Puketutu, a 1000ha property. The Johnstone farm at Puketutu was purchased in 1926 and has remained in the family since that time. Peter grew the original farm into a diverse farming operation including sheep and beef, dairy farms, quarries, contracting, trucking, forestry and other interests.

Peter combined his interest in forestry with his passion for education and was a Director of St Paul's Collegiate School Forestry Venture. He was made a Fellow of the School for his services and was involved with harvesting the first crop of trees in 2010. He was also passionate about the conservation and regeneration of native bush areas.

Peter was a great believer in training and encouraging young people to make a career in farming. Over the years many young people came to work at Puketutu and most continued with careers in agriculture some of which included, junior shepherds and farm management positions. Others were assisted into business ownership.

Peter was a committed family man, he married Margaret in 1967 and had 4 children. Peter and Margaret encouraged all the family to complete a Tertiary education. He was a top farmer and businessman, contributed to the community, and was on the Board of Hillview Home for 10 years. He was widely travelled but very content to call the North King Country home. A true man of the land.

1. Purpose

The Peter Wallace Johnstone Memorial Scholarship was established by the Johnstone family and the BNZ, to encourage and promote study towards the Agricultural Industry at Lincoln University. The scholarship recognises the value Peter put on education and also recognises the long association he had with the BNZ as both a former employee and longstanding customer.

2. Number/Value

One scholarship will be offered annually to a full-time student studying at Lincoln University. The annual value of the scholarship shall be \$6000 towards tuition fees or living expenses.

3. Eligibility

- (a) Applicants must be full-time students who have successfully completed at least one year of their course of study, but who have not yet graduated.
- (b) Applicants will be from the King Country.
- (c) Applicants must be New Zealand Citizens or Permanent Residents.

4. Selection Criteria

Students who are studying Degree or Diploma courses in Agriculture and wanting to pursue a career in farming or the rural sector.

5. Selection Committee

The Scholarship shall be awarded based on a recommendation of a Selection Committee which shall comprise:

- The Convenor of the Scholarships Committee, or nominee
- A member of the Johnstone Family, or nominee.

The Selection Committee may request the applicant to attend an interview as part of the selection process.

The Selection Committee may refrain from making an award if it finds no candidate of sufficient merit.

6. Tenure

- (a) The scholarship is tenable for one year.
- (b) The scholarship is tenable with any other scholarship, award or bursary, only with prior approval from the selection committee.
