



Banks Peninsula Ecological Restoration Scholarship Regulations

Background

Living Streams Community Nursery is a small eco-sourced native plant nursery located at Little River, mainly run by volunteers. Our goal is to "Green the Peninsula".

The Nursery is the inspiration of local environmentalist Annelies Pekelharing of Little River, who is driven by a passion for native plants, riparian planting and a strong sense of community. It began life over ten years ago on a small area of public land in Little River, with keen volunteers collecting seeds and propagating native plants. An early community project was planting the banks of the Okana River.

In 2017 the Nursery became an Incorporated Charitable Trust. We have a thriving site in Little River, on Christchurch City Council land behind the Library. Volunteers meet twice a week to sow seeds, prick out seedlings, pot up and cherish our eco-sourced plants. Seeds are collected by volunteers in the Herbert and Akaroa ecological zones.

We employ a part-time nursery manager and occasionally use local contractors for improvements, such as the new irrigation system. Our income is from nursery sales.

Our projects are large and small. We sell eco-sourced plants to local gardeners, to farmers with reforestation projects, the Christchurch City Council and Environment Canterbury (ECan) for community plantings, and to local community groups for projects, such as school or riparian plantings.

We are enthusiastic about promoting native regeneration on Banks Peninsula by providing a scholarship for Lincoln University students. Successful recipients will be further supported by introductions to Peninsula conservation groups – allowing for opportunities for local experience, work, study or research.

1. Purpose

Living Springs Nursery has established this scholarship in 2025 to support a Lincoln University postgraduate student with an interest in ecological restoration on Banks Peninsula.

2. Number/Value

Up to two \$5,000 scholarships (at the discretion of the selection committee) will be offered annually to full-time postgraduate students with a research project (existing or proposed) on ecological restoration on Banks Peninsula.

3. Eligibility

Applicants must be full-time postgraduate students from Lincoln University studying ecology, plant science, agriculture or horticulture; with an interest in undertaking research in ecological restoration on Banks Peninsula.





4. Selection Criteria

The criteria for selection will be

- a. Academic Merit
- b. Applicants must be able to demonstrate their interest to undertake postgraduate research in ecological restoration on Banks Peninsula.
- c. Students with barriers to university study are encouraged to apply; e.g. (but not limited to) financial, first generation at university, minority groups, dependents.

5. Selection Committee

The scholarship shall be awarded based on a recommendation of the selection committee which shall comprise:

- a. A representative from the Scholarship Committee or nominee.
- b. A representative from Lincoln University's Department of Pest Management and Conservation or nominee.
- c. A representative from the Alumni and Development Office or nominee.

Shortlisted applications will be presented to the Living Stream Nursery (or nominee) for their consideration and recommendation.

The selection committee may request the applicant to attend an interview of no more than 20 minutes as part of the selection process.

The selection committee may refrain from making an award if it finds no candidate of sufficient merit.

6. Tenure

- a. The scholarship is tenable for one year.
- b. The scholarship is tenable with any other scholarship, bursary or award unless the conditions of the other award preclude it.
- **c.** Successful scholars will be expected to present their research project to Banks Peninsula community at community meetings, and must be willing to participate in editorial content i.e. news articles.

Applications must be submitted by the due date advertised on the Application Form.

Applications received after the closing date may not be considered. References sent to the Scholarships Office should be clearly marked with your name and the name of the scholarship(s) for which you are applying. Referees should not be asked to send their references to you, as they must have the opportunity to be completely frank. If official documents are requested as part of your scholarship application, please do not send original documents.
