

BACKGROUND

THE FUNDS FOR THE JOHN RICHARD TEMPLIN SCHOLARSHIP ARE PROVIDED BY A TRUST, ESTABLISHED BY THE LATE JOHN RICHARD TEMPLIN IN 1958. HORTICULTURE AND ENGINEERING WERE HIS TWO LOVES AND MR TEMPLIN AND HIS WIFE, ENDEAVOURED TO FURTHER THESE WHEN THEY WERE NO LONGER AMONG US.

A graduate of Ohio State University and for many years a Consulting Engineer in Christchurch, John passed away in 1961.

Perpetual Guardian, as Sole Trustee, oversees the awarding of the Scholarship funding. We work alongside a Selection Committee that comprises of representatives from the University of Canterbury, Lincoln University, The Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture and Duncan Cotterill Law Firm.

THE SCHOLARSHIP

The J R Templin Scholarship was established to provide Scholarships for students in Engineering and Horticulture and is open to graduates from the University of Canterbury or Lincoln University.

The Scholarship is tenable for research, higher studies or practical experience in engineering or horticulture, at a University or Institution in the United States of America or Canada. The University or Institution must be approved by Perpetual Guardian and the Selection Committee.

Tenure of the scholarship is for one year, but this may be extended for a second year pending assessment by the Selection Committee.

The Scholarship covers tuition costs and reasonable costs of travel, accommodation and related living expenses for the duration of the study period.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Applications for 2022 to the John Richard Templin Scholarship are available from Monday 3rd October.

The closing date for entries to the Scholarship is Monday 31st October 2022 at 5pm.

Applicants must be under 30 years of age, of Māori or Pākehā descent and a New Zealand or British citizen.

Upon expiry of the scholarship, the scholar must return and gift New Zealand 'the benefit of knowledge and experience obtained by them' whilst living and studying in North America and Canada.

Applications must include conditional acceptance from the applicant's preferred choice of University or Institution, together with a comprehensive budget breakdown.

The budget should include estimated costs for tuition, accommodation, study resources, personal expenses, insurances and travel.

SCHOLARSHIP TIMELINE

Following the closing date, applications for the Scholarship are compiled and sent to the Selection Committee for their perusal and comment.

During the review process, the Selection Committee will shortlist applicants to progress to the interview stage.

We anticipate interviews will take place during the months of December 2022 and January 2023, pending availability of the Selection Committee and applicants as this is the height of the summer holiday period.
