Regulations

Background

Trevor Kitchin was a Lincoln graduate and well respected experienced rural valuer. Trevor was an enormous part of the Hawkes Bay and Gisborne team, having been part of the business for over 33 years (formally Telfer Young). He was well known as a supportive colleague, mentor and great friend to many. He was involved in the Institute, always willing to assist a fellow professional and passionate about training graduates. He also believed in good work life balance. Unfortunately, we lost Trevor very suddenly in Sept 2022, and he has left a huge hole in our team and the industry.

The CBRE Trevor Kitchin Rural Scholarship is specifically aimed at assisting rural talent excel at property studies at Lincoln University while memorializing Trevor and his immense contribution to the rural property industry.

1. Purpose

CBRE has established this scholarship in 2023 to encourage and reward excellence for students wishing to make a career in the rural land and property industry.

2. Number/Value

One scholarship will be offered annually to a full-time student in their second year of study at Lincoln University with a value of \$2,500 towards tuition fees.

3. Eligibility

- (a) Applicants who have successfully passed their first 18 24 months of study towards the Bachelor of Land and Property Management degree with a rural specialisation are eligible to apply.
- (b) Applicants must be New Zealand Citizens or Permanent Residents.
- (c) Applicants must be able to demonstrate a preference for a career in the rural land and property sector.

Selection Criteria

The criteria for selection will be:

- (d) Academic Merit
- (e) Communication and Interpersonal Skills
- (f) Potential to succeed

Candidates may be asked to attend an interview as part of the selection process.

4. Selection Committee

The scholarship shall be awarded based on the recommendation of a selection committee which shall comprise:

The Convenor of the Scholarships Committee, or nominee An academic with experience in the property sector A representative from CBRE.

The selection committee may refrain from making an award if it finds no candidate of sufficient merit.

5. Tenure

- (a) The scholarship is tenable for one year.
- (b) The scholarship is tenable with any other scholarship, bursary or award unless the conditions of the other award preclude it.
