

Hotel Scholarship





Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton aims to support those seeking a career in the hotel industry and, by doing so, engage with our community and create exciting opportunities for the next generation of hoteliers. As such, the hotel is excited to collaborate with Lincoln University and offer an opportunity for students enrolled in the Bachelor of Commerce - Hotel and Tourism Management at Lincoln University.

Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton is a 192-room hotel set on 5 acres of landscaped gardens. The Chateau has been an iconic Christchurch hotel since 1975 and joined Hilton Worldwide in 2016. Along with our accommodation facilities, the hotel boasts one restaurant - the Garden Court Brasserie - the Den Bar and 7 conference and event venues.

Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton Scholar will receive a scholarship valued at \$3,000.00 and experience working in all areas of operations while working alongside experienced operational and managerial professionals.

Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton Scholarship Conditions

1. The Scholar

The successful applicant to Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton Scholarship will be known as Chateau on the Park Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton Scholar, and a full-time student in enrolled in the <u>Bachelor of Commerce – Hotel and Tourism Management</u>, at Lincoln University.

2. Scholarship Award Value

The value of Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton Scholarship is \$3,000.00, payable in two instalments (at the end of each semester), conditional upon the Scholar achieving a B- average grade across all four courses studied that semester.

3. Scholarship Employment

The Scholarship is conditional on the applicant being able to secure part-time (agreed 10 minimum hours per week) at Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton during the year of the Scholarship. Full-time employment work may be available during semester breaks. Employment is a private and standard employment arrangement between the successful applicant and Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton and is not connected to the student's enrolment at Lincoln University. The Scholarship is only available while the Scholar is employed (as above) at Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton

4. Scholarship Duration.

The scholarship duration is one year, commencing on registration at the beginning of the year into Lincoln University's the <u>Bachelor of Commerce – Hotel and Tourism</u>

<u>Management</u>. Applications for the scholarship are received at any time. Successful Scholars are eligible to apply for following year scholarships.

5. Promotional Activities.

Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton Scholar may be involved in promotional activities related to the Scholarship with Chateau on the Park - Christchurch, a DoubleTree by Hilton.





Applications for the scholarship are received at any time each year and should be emailed to: Catherine Langdale, Human Resources Manager – Catherine.Langdale@hilton.com along with an application letter, please submit the following:

- In 500 words or less, the reasons why you should be selected as the Scholar, including the qualities and benefits you bring to the role and hotel and where you see yourself in five years.
- 2. In 250 words or less, how will your studies contribute to your immediate and long-term career plans? (Please include your vision of your immediate and long-term career plans)
- 3. A complete CV including current and previous work history and any present employment.
- 4. Your latest secondary school/tertiary academic record.

With regards to the selection process. A short list of applicants will be made and from this those on the short list will be expected to attend an interview with hotel management. A final decision on the successful applicant will be made within 3 weeks of application. All applicants will be contacted regardless of their respective outcome.
