



## Vernon Clark Memorial Scholarship

Vernon ('Vern') Raymond Clark ONZM (1923-2022) was an animal scientist on the staff of Lincoln University who started as a Technical Assistant in 1940 and retired as a Senior Lecturer in 1981.

He was the co-developer of the Coopworth breed of sheep, which in time became New Zealand's second most numerous breed. He was awarded a Life Membership of the Coopworth Sheep Society of New Zealand and also held a Life Membership of the NZ Society of Animal Production.

Vern was the first New Zealander to qualify as an Associate of the Institute of Science and Technology, University of London.

Before service in World War Two (Army and Air Force), Vern worked with the celebrated animal scientist Professor CP McMeekan. Following the war, he had a long partnership with Professor of Animal Husbandry Ian Coop.

At Lincoln University Vern's name lives on as one of the few to have held the combination of three top awards - the Bledisloe Medal for services advancing New Zealand's interests and the reputation of the University, awarded in 1989; the Lincoln University Medal for outstanding voluntary services to the cultural life and fabric of the University, awarded in 2012; and appointment as an Officer of the New Zealand Order of Merit (ONZM) in 2005 for services to agriculture and the community.

Vern and wife Thelma lived in Lincoln, where he was a pillar of the community contributing at all levels to local organisations. He was a leader in the development of the original Lincoln Community Centre, worked as a volunteer and was Patron for Lincoln Community Care, was President of the local RSA, and a leading light in Rotary. One of Lincoln's main roads, Vernon Drive, carries his name in recognition of his outstanding contributions to the local community.

This Scholarship stands in memory of Vern Clark and his teaching and research services to Lincoln University; his lifetime of work for the township of Lincoln; and his deep associations with animal husbandry and animal production in New Zealand and internationally.

#### Background

#### Regulations

#### 1. Purpose

The Vernon Clark Memorial Scholarship was established in 2024 to support a Lincoln University student who is completing their second, third or fourth years of study towards a Bachelor of Science (Animal Science) or other undergraduate degree with a focus on Animal Science.

#### 2. Number/Value

One scholarship will be offered annually to a full-time student studying at Lincoln University. The annual value of the scholarship shall be \$2,000 towards tuition fees.

#### 3. Eligibility

- a. Applicants must be full-time students registered in their second, third or fourth years of study towards a Bachelor of Science (Animal Science) or other undergraduate degree with a focus on Animal Science.
- b. Applicants must be New Zealand Citizens or Permanent Residents.

#### 4. Selection Criteria

The criteria for selection will be

- a. Academic Merit
- b. Evidence of and/or planned activity to work in and develop a career in animal science/ animal husbandry disciplines.

#### 5. Selection Committee

The scholarship shall be awarded based on a recommendation of a selection committee which shall comprise:

- a. A representative from the Lincoln University Alumni and Development Office or nominee;
- b. A representative of the Clark Family.

The selection committee may request the applicant to attend an interview of no more than 20 minutes as part of the selection process.

The selection committee may refrain from making an award if it finds no candidate of sufficient merit.

#### 6. Tenure

- a. The scholarship is tenable for one academic year.
- b. Previous recipients may apply for a continuing scholarship.c. The scholarship is tenable with any other scholarship, award or bursary.

Send only copies that have been certified by a Justice of the peace, a solicitor, or a staff member in the Lincon University registry. **Unless specifically requested, please do not send a curriculum vitae.** Lincoln University accepts no responsibility to return any original documents submitted.

Information submitted with your application must be true and correct.

A breach of Lincoln University's polices or procedures, including a disciplinary or code of conduct finding against you, may result in a scholarship being rescinded.

Information provided by you as part of your application, together with information already held by Lincoln University (including your academic record), will be shared with, and considered by, the Scholarship's Selection Committee.
